

## OPEN MONDAY SAYS DIRECTOR

## Instruction Classes, Sports, and Activities Start Second Week

**June 1, 1940**--Juneau's recreational center for both children and adults, Evergreen Bowl, will be officially opened for the summer next Monday according to Harold F. Roth, Juneau school instructor and director of the Bowl.

Regular classes in woodwork, swimming, life saving, tennis, golf, basketball and other activities are not to be started until the beginning of the following week, however, said Roth. The major portion of the first week is to be used in getting the Bowl ready for the summer's activities.

Director Roth wishes to call attention to the rule that the tennis courts are to be reserved exclusively for adults from noon Saturday until Monday morning at 8 o'clock and that the time ruling pertains to holidays also. Younger tennis fans may use the courts during this reserved time if there are no adults desiring to use them.

"A large number of persons have been using the tennis courts during the fine weather we have enjoyed so far this summer, "said Roth. "And on many of the days a large number of persons had to leave disappointed because the present facilities are not adequate for the increasing number of tennis fans. During tournament time reservations for the courts may be made at the recreational office at the "Bowl."

The recreational director said the telephone company has again offered to donate a telephone for the recreation center. [Daily Alaska Empire]

## **Update on Cope Park Construction**

May 11, 2016--Construction has begun at Cope Park, but contractors have experienced some delays in the installation of the utility lines, according to a Tuesday city press release. The park and the access road into the park are expected to be open again by June 1.

The Christopher Trail and Ball Field can be accessed by the Seventh Street Stairway or the Flume Trail; however, intermittent closures of these access routes are anticipated during the same timeframe.

Construction of the park will continue throughout the summer season.

In the release, the city apologized for any inconvenience and suggested using one of the other nearby parks downtown, such as Capital School Park (located at Fifth and Seward Streets) or Chicken Yard Park (located at the corner of Sixth and Kennedy Streets). [Juneau Empire]
