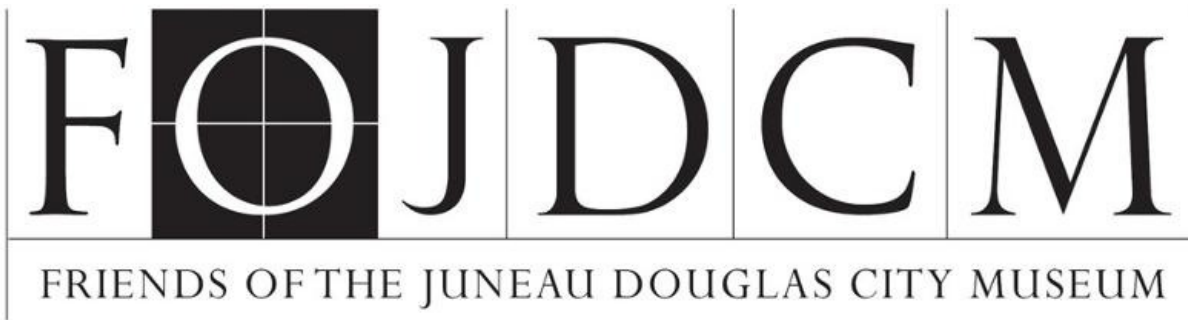

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CENTRAL DAIRY PLANT WILL BE STARTED HERE

June 25, 1936---Establishment of a central dairy products distributing plant in Juneau to better serve the residents of this community was announced today by Juneau Dairies Inc, a corporation made up of four dairies here. Articles of incorporation were filed with the Territorial Auditor today. It was announced the new distributing plant will start operation on July 1.

L.H. Smith of the Juneau Dairy is president of the new company; Frank Meier of Glacier Dairy, vice president; Joseph A. Kendler of the Alaska Dairy, secretary; and George Danner of the Mendenhall, treasurer. Capital is \$50,000.

Temporary operations will be at the Juneau Dairy but it is planned to build a creamery and ice cream plant and hire an experienced manager. In the meantime, Mr. Smith will act in dual capacity of President and Manager.

There will be no increase in the price of milk at the present time, it was announced. It was explained the main purpose is to better serve the milk consumers of the community.

It is anticipated to handle all kinds of dairy products when the company's new plant is built and operating. *Daily Alaska Empire*
