

# The Marie Darlin Prize Requisites



The Marie Darlin Prize recognizes outstanding works of artistic, literary, performative, or scholarly merit that concern the cultures and peoples of Southeast Alaska, the Yukon, or northern British Columbia. The prize is awarded annually to an individual or collaboration whose work, through a combination of vision and shared sense of community, expresses a regional commitment to women's rights, social history, or community advocacy.

Marie Darlin was born in 1925, the descendant of pioneer grandparents who arrived in Juneau in 1894. She lived her entire life in Juneau, and became a passionate and dedicated Juneau historian, community watchdog, and advocate for senior citizens, until her death at age 93 in June of 2018. This award honors her life and legacy.

In accordance with wishes of Marie Darlin and donors, the Juneau-Douglas City Museum administers the Marie Darlin Prize and the Juneau Community Foundation oversees the fund. Prize nominees are writers, visual artists, performing artists, or scholars from Alaska or elsewhere who have completed a significant work that emphasizes community values and regional identity. Prize nominees are reviewed by a selection committee, which determines the winner. A cash prize of \$5,000 is awarded annually and may be used as the recipient wishes.

## Eligibility

Nominees must be either a U.S. citizen or U.S. tax-eligible citizen of another nation.

Nominees are:

- Writers of fiction, poetry, nonfiction, or scholarly works.
- Practitioners of visual, plastic, graphic, fiber or traditional arts and crafts.
- Performers, directors, or creators of theater, music, film, or dance.

Nominees must have completed a work of enduring value that has within the past five years been published by a notable press, featured in a solo or group exhibition, or performed at a significant venue.

## Nomination

Any individual or organization may submit nominations for the Marie Darlin Prize. Required nomination materials for selection committee consideration:

- A letter of nomination addressed to the Marie Darlin Prize Committee that details how the work of a writer, artist, performance artist or creator expresses a commitment to women's rights, community or senior advocacy, or indigenous or regional identity in Southeast Alaska, the Yukon, or northern British Columbia.
- Additional letters of support from community members or organizations who have been inspired by or benefited from the nominee's work.
- A two-page resume or vitae that highlights the nominee's record of accomplishments.

Submissions received between November 1<sup>st</sup> and April 3<sup>rd</sup> are eligible for award during the calendar year of the closing date. Nominations remain under active consideration for a five-year period.

## Selection

Nominations are reviewed annually by a selection committee, composed of:

- Juneau-Douglas City Museum Curator or Director
- Recognized visual, plastic, graphic or traditional artist
- Published literary author or poet
- Professional director, playwright, composer or choreographer
- Professional historian or journalist
- Regional culture bearer

The Juneau-Douglas City Museum Curator oversees the committee's deliberations of nominees. The committee votes upon and recommends the annual prize recipient. The Juneau-Douglas City Museum Director confirms the recommendation or, in the case of a tie, casts the deciding vote.

The annual recipient of the Marie Darlin Prize is personally notified and a press release is sent out by September 15. The recipient is honored at an award banquet the following month.

## Award Recipients

Marie Darlin Prize recipients:

- Are publically recognized at an annual event of invited guests.
- Receive a commemorative gift.
- Receive a cash prize of \$5,000.
- Have their names added to the Marie Darlin Prize commemorative plaque on permanent display in the Juneau-Douglas City Museum.
- Gain further recognition through a profile posted next to the Marie Darlin Prize plaque for one year at the on the Juneau–Douglas City Museum, as well as a permanently posted to the Juneau–Douglas City Museum and Juneau Community Foundation websites.
- Are considered for future membership on the Selection Committee
